



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12 Tips on Successful IEP Meetings

- Send parents the Notice of Invitation of Committee Meeting 3-5 days in advance (at least 3 attempts)
- Provide parents copy of revised IEP
- Notify ALL IEP Committee members of the scheduled meeting date, location, and time.
- Collect data and any pertinent information/documents prior to meeting date
- Come to the meeting positive and prepared
- Have supporting documents/class work.
- Please remember to bring IEP binder, Written Prior Notice, and IEP Committee documentation form.)
- Provide copy of Procedural Safeguards to parents and explain it for their understanding.
- Make introductions and discuss purpose for meeting.
- Ask and encourage parent participation.
- Gain IEP participant signatures.
- Complete and send Written Prior Notice for any actions proposed and/or refused.
